It has more recently been published in the anthology *The Mighty Swordsmen* (Lancer Books, 1970), and the collections *The Conan Chronicles Volume 2: The Hour of the Dragon* (Gollancz, 2001) and *Conan of Cimmeria: Volume Three (1935-1936)* (Del Rey, 2005). It's set in the pseudo-historical Hyborian Age and concerns Conan's battle against a savage tribe of Picts in the unsettled lands beyond the infamous Black River.

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
