Evaluation of Expedient Techniques for Strengthening Floor Joist Systems in Residential Buildings 1975 Expedient techniques for reinforcing wood floor joist systems were evaluated by building 15 test specimens and subjecting them to static loads up to 200-kip loader. Each specimen consisted of three 2- by 10-inch by 16-foot floor joists (16 inches on center). Two sheets of 3/4-inch plywood and two sheets of 4- by 8-foot by 1/4-inch Masonite were centered and nailed to the joists. A 2- by 10-inch header board was nailed to each end of the floor specimen. Unreinforced and reinforced floor specimens were tested.
